A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DANI:

He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" -Micah 6:8

After spending the first two evenings with the 2021 Simpson Youth Academy scholars, I knew the ministry of the academy would transform my life. For seven evenings in June, I had the privilege of teaching, supporting, and working with the 25 high schoolers who gathered at Simpson College to ask the tough questions of their faith with one another. Some of the scholars want to be teachers and doctors when they get older; others want to be professional musicians and athletes. What they all have in common though, is that they are all courageous enough to ask tough questions about their faith and how their faith will impact what it is they feel called to do with their precious lives.

Each evening I helped plan and lead worship with these scholars and every night I left with more hope for the future of the church! Not because these scholars are the future of the church-- but because they are the present. They are the church right here, right now.

Many Christians today worry about the future of the church. Maybe it's because we're worried that our youth group gatherings are smaller than they used to be, or our Sunday school classrooms are empty. We might look for reasons to blame the youth for not finding an interest in church the way we did or maybe we blame young adults for not growing their families as early as we did.

But what if we worry so much about the future that we aren't noticing the gifts and the graces of today?

What if we are so concerned with how few people come to church that we neglect to celebrate the people who do come and care?

I cannot fully explain why my week at Simpson Youth Academy was so special. In fact, I asked the Director of the Academy, Rev. Eric Rucker, what he thought makes this ministry so transformative. He said to me. "Because the Simpson Youth Academy saves lives."

When communities of faith or families create unsafe environments for youth to ask questions about their faith, passions, or life in general, the Academy sometimes becomes that first safe and brave space for a young person. The Academy invites all the scholars to embrace honesty, even if their churches hadn't in the past. The Academy invited this authenticity and wasn't afraid to hear the honest truth because that's what happens when we are in compassionate relationship with each other, right? When we enter into healthy relationships, we need space for criticism and critique in order to grow; celebration and play in order to find joy; listening and reflection in order to experience love. All of this happened at the Academy and the church is called to create this kind of brave space as well.

When the prophet Micah presents this tough question concerning faith in chapter 6, verse 8, his community likely responded in many ways. Some might have wondered what's the point in loving kindness and walking humbly if there is no future for our people? Some might have considered this to be too tough of a question to answer because they couldn't agree what it really means to love kindness and act justly. But the scholars at Simpson Youth Academy considered this question with each other all week. They (and I) discovered that there isn't much better to do with our precious lives than to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with our God. One way we can live into justice, kindness, and humility right now is by supporting and inviting all youth to find a loving and supportive home among our church walls. May it be so.
