ANNUAL CONFERENCE

FRIDAY: Under the banner, "Creating Difference Makers in New Faith Communities", clergy and laity gathered for the 175th Iowa Annual Conference June 8-11 at the Iowa Events Center/Hy-Vee Hall. The clergy and laity sessions opened the Conference at 7:00 p.m. Included during the evening was the recognition of 3 new certified Lay Speakers and 25 School for Lay Ministry graduates. There were four 30 minute laity mini workshops to attend offering practical tips for local congregations. I was unable to attend a workshop as I was a member of the Daily Proceedings Staff helping to gather conference information.

SATURDAY: Bishop Laurie Haller officially called the Conference to order at 9:00 a.m. She explained the purpose of Annual Conference is worship, conferencing, fellowship, enacting legislation and making corporate decisions. The Bishop explained that each day of the Conference attendees would pause and pray for 4 minutes from 2:23 p.m. to 2:26 p.m. for the work of the Commission On a Way Forward. There will be a special session of the General Conference on Feb. 23-26, 2019. The Commission was formed to help discern a way forward in the United Methodist Church around human sexuality. There are three plans: Traditionalist Plan, One Church Plan and Connectional Conference Plan. The Council of Bishops' recommendation is the One Church Plan. In 2019, Annual Conference will be in session four days, June 8-11. It was approved to hold the 2020 Annual Conference June 6-8. Thirty-eight clergy persons retired and were honored during a retirement celebration. Before the dinner break, delegates chose one of six workshops to attend. I chose "Fresh Expressions".

SUNDAY: The Ordering of Ministry was celebrated Sunday morning. Five Elders were ordained, six were commissioned (including Pastor Wendy) and 6 were recognized as Course of Study graduates. The Bishop used the image of God as the divine Potter throughout her ordination message with an actual potter on the dais throwing a pot as the Bishop spoke. Communion was served to those present and Don and I were honored to be served by Wendy. Her mother and Greta assisted her. The Iowa Conference is in the process of developing a Mental Health Taskforce because of the huge need to raise awareness of the mental health crisis in Iowa. Mental health training will begin in each District in the fall. A round table discussion between several General Conference delegates took place over the current human sexuality struggle. It was a very frank and emotional encounter. The memorial celebration memorialized 50 people including Lois Miller, wife of Rev. Bill Miller who pastored at Centennial from 1992-1996. Rev. Miller was memorialized at the 2017 Iowa Annual Conference.

MONDAY: The proposed 2019 budget was approved by the Conference. With a \$505,925 decrease, the total budget approved was \$14,288,286. Several of Conference Treasurer Maggie Biggs' statistics were: average worship attendance-47,080, church school attendance-15,867, adults and young adults in small groups-3,360 and membership in the United Methodist Church in Iowa is 158,049. The diakonos were acknowledged and gave their annual report in skit form. The premise of the diakonos is based on the scripture, Mark 9:35. The Fixing of Appointments was held and Pastor Wendy will continue to serve at Centennial. The following seven churches closed or are closing in 2018 are: Elberon UMC, Beaver UMC (Beaver Yoke), Fort Dodge Riverside UMC, Cincinnati, West Grove UMC, Riverton UMC and Union Memorial Church, Milford.

Before the conclusion of the last day of Conference, an hour-long, open mic conversation on the Way Forward was added. Conference attendees were given 90 seconds to speak at microphones. Approximately 35 people spoke - 20 clergy and 15 lay members. The Bishop expressed that the dialogue was rich, powerful and spirit-filled.

Five offerings were collected during the Conference for a total of \$32,050.19.

Following the Bishop recapping the four days of the Conference, the 2018 lowa Annual Conference adjourned at 3:07 p.m. (A big thank you to Don Hiatt, Brandi Jackson and Brooke Person for driving golf carts to take delegates to and from the parking lots, hotels and the conference center. Gaylen Heaberlin was scheduled to drive Monday afternoon but because the Conference adjourned early, his shift was cancelled.)
