## ***A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DANI:***

What a whirlwind! The last time I wrote a newsletter, I naively expected we would return to normal in a matter of weeks. And the time before that, I had absolutely no idea physical distancing would become our new normal. Days have felt like weeks and weeks have felt like months as my regular pace slowed down and I had less places to go or be. Most days I feel as if I'm riding an emotional rollercoaster. I often wake up with a sense of hope as I breathe in deep the fresh scent of spring from my blooming geraniums or the beautiful sight of the mini leaves blooming from the branches of my tree that looked so barren just a few weeks ago. Yet, as afternoon rolls around, I might have a new set of emotions, as I feel weighed down by the conflicting messages between governmental officials and doctors as the former lifts social distancing orders while the latter presumes the death toll peaks have yet to arrive. And once the evening arrives, I'm often exhausted from the information overload from news stations, social media posts, blogs, and every update about the COVID-19 situation. Once I fall asleep and morning arrives, I start the emotional rollercoaster (or at least some version of it) all over again!

I know I'm not alone in this emotional rollercoaster, and if you have experienced something similar, I hope you know you, too, are not alone. The good news-- in all of this change--is that I'm finding new places of hope. Wherever I find hope, I find God as I remember Christ's words in Matthew's gospel, when he instructs to the crowds, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest" (11:28). So, these are the places where I'm finding hope, and I pray that you might find hope in these parts of your life, too:

- In prayer for you, our church, our community, our world.
- In giving myself permission to rest.
- In the tiny leaves popping up in the tree in my backyard.
- In the playfulness of my dog, Dolly, whose life has not been dramatically affected by COVID-19.
- In the rain that nourishes the bright green grass in my front yard.
- In the reminder that our church is not just a place-- but it is truly a people.
- In you.

Especially over the past few weeks, **you** have given me hope. At times we might become comfortable in the four walls of the church, but the pandemic has thrown us out and demanded us to rediscover and invent new ways of being the church. And you-- the church-- have shown up! In your prayer for each other, in your calls to one another, in the errands you run to help your neighbors, in the love you've shown-- in all of this-- you have proved how the church is not just a place; the church is a **people**. I'm inspired by the ways you've adapted to change, learned new skills, shared your love in new ways, and so much more. And I pray that as we move forward, we will continue to learn new ways to share God's love with one another as we continue to keep ourselves and our neighbors healthy and safe.

Earlier this year, we discussed how to share the love of God with the world as Methodists who live out John Wesley's General Rules to "Do No Harm, Do Good, & Stay in Love with God." In our current situation, we need to implement these General Rules into our lives, more than ever.

As we dedicate our lives to doing no harm, doing good, and staying in love with God, we are choosing to act in ways that are healthy for the whole of our community. So, we will continue to cancel or postpone all in person events and services through the month of May. Per Bishop Laurie Haller's request, church leadership will reexamine at the end of the month if we are ready to return for in-person worship. From our living rooms, to our front porch, we gather as we are able, ready to be of service to one another and to this world. We ask, O God, for courage as we learn and re-discover how to build the community of hope and of love. We are apart, but we are together in spirit-- offering our love, our commitment, our hope, and our prayers. It is a new way, but an old way, that we come together in worship this day. For Your love that extends beyond the walls of our church into our many homes and lives, we give thanks. Amen.*


